Other things the Communication Committee is working on include: a promotional DVD; updating the Web site, Web editor job description and evaluation form; and promoting our ministry at area colleges. It is a priority to get the Web site up and running again!

We are so excited about the retreat for 2009. Lee Nagel, Executive Director of NCCL and long-time friend of WDREF will be our retreat director. Yee haw! The award nomination and award application form deadlines have been extended. If you are interested in applying please return materials by September 23.

Support in Ministry Henriette M. Mackin Award

This award is presented to a person or organization, which has given outstanding support to the catechetical ministry in a parish or diocese in the state of Wisconsin.

It is open to both paid and volunteer people. (eg. a catechist, priest, secretary, parent, liturgist, janitor, parish organization, etc.) Diocesan personnel are not eligible.

To complete the nomination process, you MUST secure a letter of recommendation from one other person. In addition, please ask your nominee for a resume or vitae. For the full award application and information on where to mail all three documents, please visit **www.wdref.org.** The nomination deadline is September 23, 2008.

Leadership in Ministry Stephen C. Gilmour Award

This award is presented to a degreed professional person actively engaged in parish catechetical ministry on a directorship level.

The person should be outstanding for his/her leadership and achievements in the catechetical field and must be a member of WDREF through one of the following: ProClaym, DARE, MARE-DA, MDREO, SUMMIT. (WDREF Board Members are not eligible.)

Young Adult Scholarship Available for NCCL Annual Conference

To encourage young adults to consider the catechetical ministry, NCCL is offering up to 25 scholarships to the NCCL Annual Conference, held next year in Detroit, MI on April 27-30, 2009. The purpose of this young adult initiative is to:

- Raise awareness about professional catechetical ministry among young adults who might be discerning ecclesial professional roles.
- Foster arch/diocesan involvement in bringing forth strong candidates for professional catechetical ministry among young adults.
- Create an awareness in young adults of the benefits of gathering with NCCL, the professional organization for catechetical leaders which includes parish and diocesan leaders, academic members, and publishers.

Scholarship recipients will receive a special pass allowing them to participate in all Liturgies and prayer services, major presentations, learning sessions and Hot Topics, as well as the NCCL Awards Luncheon, Harcourt reception, OSV Brunch, and Sadlier Event (dinner and entertainment) and visiting the exhibits. The value of this award is over \$400. It does not include travel, lodging, and other meals and expenses. To be eligible, candidates must:

- Be under 40 years of age.
- Have some ecclesial ministry experience.
- Never have been a professional parish or diocesan catechetical leader.
- Be able to cover the additional expenses not included in this award.
- Be nominated by their diocesan catechetical director.
- Not have received this award for a previous NCCL conference.

If you would like to place your name in nomination for this award, contact your diocesan director and ask him or her to nominate you. Your diocesan director will then submit the request by e-mailing Joanie McKeown, NCCL Membership Committee chair, at joanie50@consultant.com. The e-mail should include the following information:

 Candidates' names and contact information, including e-mail address.

- A brief description of their current professional and/or ministry involvement, including their interest and/or participation in professional catechetical ministry.
- Current educational background and future intentions on pursuing degrees related to the catechetical field.

The deadline for scholarship submissions is January 30, 2008. NCCL's Membership Committee will determine the awardees and notify them via e-mail by February 13, 2008. We encourage you to approach the "young adults" (those under 40) whom you know, including your CREs who are seeking continuing education, to see if they are interested in this young adult scholarship. Last year over a dozen more scholarships could have been awarded, if NCCL had received more applications.

NCCL Now Operating under Governance Policies

How does a group as large as NCCL manage the many details of its organizational life? When NCCL opened the doors to parish catechetical leaders over a dozen years ago, and hundreds of PCLs joined the organization, this question moved from the back burner to the front burner.

To avoid a duplication of efforts and the chance that some items might fall through the cracks, new governance policies have now been put into place. These policies enumerate the specific responsibilities of NCCL's Board and the Executive Director who is hired by the Board.

The policies place with the Executive Director the responsibilities for the management of NCCL. The Board sets the vision for NCCL, the parameters for the office of the Executive Director and monitors the work of the Executive Director. Ongoing dialogue, including regular conference calls and updates from the Executive Director are proving to be an effective way of keeping everyone informed so that the work of the Executive Director is always in line with the vision of the organization.

This year's theme is *Cherish the Past, Embrace the Future* and the messages conveyed by our presenters embody this premise so well.

Sr. Angela Ann Zukowski, MHSH is the director of the University of Dayton's Institute for Pastoral Initiatives and the Virtual Learning Community of Faith Formation. She will present the following two topics:

New Perspectives on E-Catechesis: Crossing the 21st Century Communications Threshold

Today catechists are challenged to forge into a rapidly expanding e-culture that is transforming the educational, social, political and corporate life of our world. E-culture is the new missionary territory of the 21st Century. With or without us this expanding e-culture weaves its way into the fabric of our lives. As catechists, we need to be informed if our catechetical ministry is to make a difference in the lives of those we seek to minister to today.

Opportunities of E-Communication for Effective Catechesis

The Internet and new media resources are yeasting copious opportunities and challenges for engaging in catechesis today. How can parish catechetical leaders hone their Internet and media consciousness and skills to incorporate the wealth of these resources into our catechetical environments? This session will identify quality resources and methodologies for paving the way for a new e-perspective on catechesis for the 21st century.

For the past 25 years, **Dr. Michael Carotta** has lived and worked with adolescents as a Catholic schoolteacher, parish catechist, diocesan consultant, researcher and much-celebrated author. He will be speak to the topic of:

Cultivating Spiritual Awareness With Adolescents

This session will explore concrete principles and processes for helping adolescents develop spiritual sensitivities and moral imagination. Examples from the young adolescent paperback series, "Lincoln Park," will be used to illustrate these specific dynamics, including the unique function of adults as spiritual teachers.

Jacquelyne Witter is the founding director of iLLUMINARE: Called for Service, Formed in Christ, The Ministry to Ministers Project of St. Paul's Monastery in St. Paul. iLLUMINARE provides ongoing pastoral formation and spiritual renewal for experienced Church ministers. Jackie is a faculty member in the graduate Pastoral Ministry Program at Mount Marty College in Yankton, SD and a faculty member for the Murray Institute at the University of St. Thomas. Her message focuses on:

Catechesis For Our Time: Proclaiming the Legacy We Have Inherited, Entering Into The Future That Awaits Us
We will reflect on the foundations of the Faith and the rich history of the catechetical ministry as we consider the opportunities and challenges we face as catechetical leaders in the contemporary world.
