


"Life"

approach ministry, whether at church or talking to non-Catholics, I do so with two emphases. First I come as a witness and convert to the "real"

Justin Steele

Catholic Church from a diverse Protestant background. It is in large part the numerous misconceptions that keep people out of the Catholic Church. Secondly, I come as a historian and theologian to help others understand and appreciate the "original Church" founded by Jesus Christ upon the authority of His apostles.


The diversity of my Christian upbringing came from a Lutheran mother, a Seventh-day Adventist father, and a family decision to be non-denominational. With that I had friends who were Baptist, Methodist, Assemblies of God, etc. All this confusion resulted in a faith odyssey where I hit rock bottom like a young St. Augustine, saw the light of Christ, and began praying my way closer to Him. In fact, this prayer odyssey led me directly into the RCIA process in 2000 as a result of one particular prayer. Here I was able to study and contrast Catholicism and the array of Protestantism. I was received into the Church on Easter of 2001. Since then I've been active in catechetical ministry.

Following the Sacraments of Initiation I made St. Augustine patron saint of my vocation and went on to discern the priesthood. This was not my calling. Instead I went to the UW Marshfield to begin my undergrad where I met my wife, Melissa Augustine! Appropriately, we fell in love before the scales were lifted from my eyes and I realized that sign! From there, after marriage, we discerned a move to Wichita, Kansas where I earned my BA and then MTS in theology from Newman University (namesake of another convert). After the masters degree we moved home to North-central Wisconsin.

We were living in Abbotsford in the Diocese of La Crosse. The Lord then quickly opened the door for us with the position of CRE and Youth Minister for grades 7-12 up the road at Holy Rosary in Medford, Diocese of Superior. In looking into this diocese I discovered that it is only 1 of 4 within the US who has as its patron saint St. Augustine - he is still guiding us! This June my wife and I had our fourth child. In my position at Holy Rosary I was asked to be active in SUMMIT. Eventually I was asked a SUMMIT member to be the new Facilitator, which I now undertake.

In 2006 I submitted a manuscript on my conversion story to Ignatius Press. After long consideration they denied it. Yet, for the following 3 years I worked with Marcus Grodi's people of the Coming Home Network (of the EWTN show The Journey Home) to publish it. Sadly, due to a financial crisis they were unable to continue. Entrepreneurial as I am, in February of 2013 I founded Light Of Christ Press. In April I published my poignantly titled book "Praying Made Me Catholic: With the Biblical & Historical Reasons Why I Must Remain Catholic." It can be found on our blogsite at **www.LOCPress. WordPress.com**. We will be publishing the works of others as well.

I pray for everyone in catechetical ministry, that their voice and witness inspire others to become more faithful to following Christ. My hope, then, is that more Catholics show within themselves the light of Christ to others, leading to the conversion of souls.

• Business Meeting:

-USCCB has the Catechetical Sunday material available. -Evangelization Committee has designed and made available a website with links to church documents, articles, religious trends etc. that all deal with evangelization. You can join a mailing list:

• Fr. James Mallon:

-Feeding the fire of your faith, Pope Francis says, "Now go do it." We need to stir the fire of our own hearts... status quo cannot exist in our church today...passion is key... passion is connected to vision and without vision there is no passion...we need that fire in our bones to continue to do his work...do not be afraid to risk yourselves. St. Augustine says: "...without God we cannot, without us God will not."

• PCL Forum:

-The New Evangelization: we have to be out in the world and ask these questions: What is the message? How are we transmitting the message? Who needs to hear the message? How do we know they heard the message? It needs to be a freely chosen faith.

-We need to nurture the relationships we already have, pray for those who you would like to reach, share your own story and invite.

-If the Pope tweets, we should tweet!

• TED Talks:

-We need to tell our own story. Healing is transformation. Believing is seeing! The providence of God is everywhere. -We will do what it takes to get the job done-if we want it badly enough.

-We must foster a cultural change in our parishes, a cultural shift, we need to be *a welcoming church, *an evangelizing church, a church where people experience transformation and we must shift from a child centered to adult centered formation.

-Ten Keys:

- 1. Have a welcoming environment: look at it as a person who has never been there before.
- 2. Hospitality: SMILE at parishioners.
- 3. Uplifting Music: a diversity of old and new
- 4. Homilies and Testimonies: communicate a good message
- 5. Meaningful community: body language speaks the truth, name tag Sunday, prayer partners.
- 6. Experience the Holy Spirit: put a line on the budget for the Holy Spirit.
- Spiritual Growth/Discipleship: Make five expectations: To worship, to grow, to serve, to connect and to give.
- 8. Calling forth of gifts and leaders: empowerment
- 9. Formation of small communities: we need interpersonal relationships
- 10. Become an inviting church: all this requires is courage!
