DARE

We are working to promote and increase membership and we are in the final stages of approving a new contract to be used for DREs, CREs and Youth Ministers. We also continue to work on updating our diocesan Catechetical Handbook.

On October 26, St. Patrick's Church in Onalaska hosted the Fall DARE Gathering. Over 30 DREs, CREs and Youth Ministers gathered for breakfast, time to network, and time for learning as well. Fr. Mark Pierce presented on "A Gift of a Sacramental Spirituality." His presentation centered on three key words, and the questions they answered: 1) Mediation: How does God address us? By what means does the divine communicate? 2) Tradition: Where should we look for understanding of God's voice? and 3) Sacramentality: How does God channel his divine life and his grace to us? How can we access it?

Several members of DARE attended and enjoyed the 2010 Green Lake Convention. It was a fun and beautiful learning experience. Our Spring DARE Gathering is scheduled for March 15. - actively engaged in the religious education ministry in Wisconsin.
- intending to remain in the religious education field for at least two more years.
- committed to their own professional development, i.e., working towards certification, continuing education units, or a bachelor's, master's or post graduate degree in a field related to religious education ministry.

WDREF Board members and diocesan personnel are not eligible. First consideration will be given to applicants who have not been awarded a WDREF Scholarship in the last two years. In addition to the application, interested members must also secure a letter of recommendation from each of the following:

- 1. A diocesan staff person in the religious education department
- 2. Another DRE or coordinator
- 3. A parish staff member with whom you've worked within the last five years

Letters of recommendation should be mailed with the application to the address listed on the form.

NCCL nuggets

Rep. Council Update:

- The Marketing Committee is working on ways to effectively market NCCL. Ideas include table top displays and individualized e-mails.
- Once again the Representative Council was asked to call our NCCL members for feedback about the organization and to gauge attendance for this year's conference. There were 159 calls made, of which 67 were unanswered.
- Membership numbers are currently down. One of the concerns that came out of this conversation was that we should not forward the *CL Weekly* newsletter to non-members. Rather, this should remain a benefit for members only.
- We are currently participating in a fundraising campaign, entitled "\$75 for 75 years." For more information on how you can help, please visit www.nccl.org.
- NCCL's 2011 Annual Conference in Atlanta will be held May 22-26. The theme this year is *Celebrating Our Past*, *Shaping the Future*.
- The 2012 Annual Conference will be held in San Diego where we will celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the opening of Vatican II.
- We are currently working on NCCL's By-law revisions.

- In small groups we focused on a "Fed Ex" activity, writing a chapter for a "Doing Ministry for Less" book.
- We had some great discussion on the structure of the provinces. Information on how it was formed and how we work as an organization, etc. should be written down and shared with other provinces. It would be great for our historical records as well.
- The 2011 Catechetical Sunday theme is *Do this in Memory of Me*. It will focus on the Eucharist and the implementation of the Roman Missal. The 2012 theme will return to a more specific catechetical focus.
- The following is a report from Episcopal Advisor, Bishop Leonard Blair, who is the chair of the Subcommittee for the Catechism: The bishops have developed a new protocol for evaluation of textbooks, which incorporates compliance with the framework and the CCC. The lead time needed by publishers to modify their books will be taken into consideration in establishing a time frame for textbooks to be in compliance based on the new protocol once it is ready to be used.
